MORNING SESSION

10:00 a.m.

Art. 1 OPENING of MEETING:

a. CALL to ORDER: (10:00 a.m.)

Rev. K. Gehrels, vice-chair, calls the meeting to order, welcomes the delegates and thanks Kanata's Community CRC for hosting this meeting of C.E.C.;

- b. Elder Jim Crozman of Kanata shares with the delegates that they are pleased to host C.E.C., informs them about the available rooms, facilities and about some pieces of equipment, like a computer, photocopier, etc. and about the food that will be served;

- c. Elder Crozman invites the delegates to sing "Take My Life And Let It Be";
- d. he reads 1 Cor. 13 and some other texts, and then gives a brief meditation focusing on the overriding theme of all, being love and to love one another;
- e. we sing "The Church's One Foundation" and he leads in prayer which the delegates conclude by reciting "The Lord's Prayer" together;

Art. 2 ROLL-CALL:

- d. Rev. Gehrels declares Classis constituted and hands the gavel over to the chairman for this session of CEC, Rev. Daryl Meijer;

Art. 3 CHAIRMAN:

- a. Rev. Meijer welcomes all and thanks Elder Crozman for leading the opening devotions;
- b. he mentions the importance of prayer and that this is also noticed in Ottawa where we have a few groups that pray regularly for our government and for our nation;
- c. he expresses the hope that the Lord may shake all of us to work for Him and His Kingdom;
- d. delegates are asked to fill out little forms listing prayer requests which will be sent to all of the churches in C.E.C. so churches can pray for that;

Art. 4 STATED CLERK & C.I.C.:

- a. the Stated Clerk presents the correspondence, reports & materials and his own report;

MOTION: that Classis approve the work of the S.C.

CARRIED

- b. the Stated Clerk presents the work done by the C.I.C.;

MOTION: that Classis approve the work of the C.I.C....

- c. Conference in Detroit: 2 delegates are needed and this matter will be dealt with later [see Art. 14]
- d. the chairman mentions that Rev. D. Tigchelaar is unable to be present due to a death/funeral in the family, and that Rev. Bob Boertje is unable to be present because of some health problems;

Art. 5 BALLOTING: [see Art. 14 for Balloting]

- Rev. Gary VanLeeuwen presents a Balloting Form for the delegates, and some names are added to those already nominated or earlier or serving already;
- a new, updated form will be presented later;

Art. 6 REGIONAL PASTORS:

WEST:

- Rev. Ken Gehrels shares that we have heavy hearts at times when others suffer or experience difficult times: he mentions Bob Boertje (illness), David Tigchelaar (loss of his wife's grandmother), loss of infants, members dealing with personal difficulties, etc.;
- he addresses Rev. Gary Van Leeuwen who is going to leave C.E.C. in June, 2006, D.V., and he thanks Gary for his wise, stable presence in Athens and in C.E.C., and for his able work in the C.I.C. as well; "We will miss you, Gary, and may God bless you richly", he notes;
- Rev. Gehrels leads in prayer;

EAST:

- Rev. Meijer mentions the warm heart Rev. Boertje has for the pastors of the Maritime Region, and his joy that Truro received its own pastor with the coming of Rev. D. Brown;
- hope is expressed that Kentville, too, will soon receive a pastor;
- the pastors of the Maritimes are planning a retreat in May, 2006;
- Rev. Meijer leads in prayer for the Maritime pastors, and for Rev. Noordhof whose father passed away in Feb./06;

Art. 7 CHURCH COUNSELLORS:

Rev. David Vroege mentions that Kentville CRC is served by parttime pastors: Rev. Michael Veenema and Cand. Winston Visser;

- Kentville CRC has a calling committee which is trying to come up with a pastor whom they may call;

 - Rev. Ken Gehrels mentions that Kanata has gone through a process of evaluation and determining their vision and ministry plans: core values and mission;
 - Kanata has plans to call a pastor quite soon;
- the chairman welcomes: Rev. M. Veenema, Rev. W. Kuurstra, Brian Buys, Anita Hogeveen, Bill Schuurman;

Art. 8 KANATA OVERTURE: Overture Com.-1 (Charlottetown & Ottawa-Calvin)

Text of OVERTURE/MOTION of Kanata:

Given that the ad-hoc committee discussion paper on the seating of women at Classis meetings provides too many options, causing even more delay and discussion, and given that the real question is truly very straight forward, the Council of Kanata Community CRC puts forward the following motion for discussion and vote at the Spring 2006 Classis Meeting.

MOTION: That the seating of elders and/or deacons at all meetings of CEC be done based solely on the decision of the church council they represent without discrimination.

GROUNDS:

1. The selection of leaders, including elders and deacons, in the church is the responsibility of the members of the specific church body. The decisions of the congregation should be respected by the collective body of Classis, as it relates to the seating of representative leaders from the congregation, regardless of the sex of the representative. Synod and this Classis already respect the local congregation's selection of office bearers, including women. The seating of women at the Classis table is the logical extension of this existing recognition. Further, Synod recognizes the full expression of the gifts of women by ordaining women as pastors, and providing women referrals to churches seeking to fill the position of pastor.
 2. Women have been gifted equally with men by the Holy Spirit and these gifts are presently not respected under the current exclusionary Classis system. Women need to be permitted to fully use their gifts in the performance of their duties, as elders and deacons, both locally in their congregation and in the denominational bodies, including Classis.
 3. Delaying even further the inclusion of women as classical representatives will cause hardship and anxiety for these women who simply want to serve. The message, anguish, and feelings of bitterness are affecting many of church members relationship with the denomination and their faith.
 4. In order to reach the communities in which we are the church, the church needs to be relevant and provide a relevant message and example to this community. By excluding women from full service in the life of the church, we greatly reduce our effectiveness in reaching the un-churched in our society, a society in which women serve at all levels and positions.
 5. Many churches potential selection of delegates to Classis is very limited when only male elders are the desired candidates (e.g. Kanata with only 4 of our 8 and without a pastor we need to send two).
- Rev. Ken Gehrels reports for the committee, expresses appreciation to Kanata for their motion/overture;
 - the advisory com. recommends that Kanata's overture be tabled till the Fall-2006 Meeting of CEC;
 - Elder N. Patterson mentions that Kanata prepared this overture prayerfully and would like to see that CEC deal with it now;
 - after some discussion, the chairman rules that the overture be deferred till after CEC has dealt with the report from the Ad Hoc Com. re: "Seating Women at Classis E.Canada", on Sat., March 4th;

Art. 9 STUDENT FUND COM.:

A. Present Students:

- Rev. Daryl Meijer reports for this committee;
- the delegates have received a printed report;
- at present Classis is supporting 2 students: K. Norris and D. Westra;
- a C.T.seminarian, already supported by his own classis, has approached our Classis for additional funding; the Student Fund Com. is in contact with this student;

B. Winston Visser:

- Rev. David Vroege reports;
- Candidate Winston Visser of Kentville N.S. has met with and received encouragement from Rev. Vroege and Elder Dale Poel of Halifax in his desire to enter fulltime ministry in the CRC;
- Classis agrees that a letter of endorsement be written for Winston Visser by a few members of the

Student Fund Com. and Rev. Vroege;

MOTION: that CEC approve the letter written by this Ad Hoc Com.

so RULED

- Classis instructs this same Ad Hoc Com. to write a letter to the BOT of the CRCNA to ask for an extension of Winston Visser's candidacy for another year ...

so RULED

-Rev. Vroege offers prayer for the students and for Winston Visser and his family;

Art. 10 EAST CITY COMMUNITY CHURCH:

- Rev. W. Kuurstra and Brian Buys report;
- they supply the delegates with their latest NEWSLETTER;
- this church went through a review recently, and they lost some families, but some others have joined;
- they note that the members begin to show a greater sense of ownership, and there is now a move towards more congregational leadership involvement;
- their BOOKCLUB works very well and the midweek Wednesday night meetings are working out great;

- Dr. Mook deals with a variety of aspects: introduction of the matter, definitions of psychology/psychiatry, mental health & illness, referrals by pastors, role of pastors and elders, and towards the future;
- her presentation is very well received, and will no doubt be very helpful to office bearers;
- Rev. Van Leeuwen thanks her very kindly on behalf of the delegates who show their appreciation with a resounding applause.
